Lee Hah Ing Scholarship

Mr Lee Hah Ing, born in 1914 and principal of the Anglo-Chinese School from 1961 to 1969, headed the school at a critical period, not only for education in Singapore but also a critical period for Singaporeans as our country moved into independence first from Britain and then Malaysia.

In 1992, to honour his myriad contributions to building up ACS as the premier school that sends out well-rounded, educated and moral young adults into the world, Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan established a scholarship in Mr Lee's name.

Oldham Scholarship

Bishop William Fitzgerald Oldham, Founder of Anglo-Chinese School, was born in 1854 in Bangalore, India. In 1886, Rev Oldham started the Anglo-Chinese School in a small shophouse at Amoy Street. The following year, the school moved to a bigger building in Coleman Street.

In 1963, to commemorate the contributions of the ACS founder, Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan, a distinguished ACS alumnus, established a scholarship in the bishop's name.

Nagle Scholarship

Rev. J.S. Nagle was principal of Anglo-Chinese School when Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan joined the school in 1918. Even as a child, he was deeply impressed by Rev Nagle's approach to education and the care and concern he lavished on the children in his charge. Rev Nagle initiated a "contact campaign" that eventually led to the formation of the Anglo-Chinese School Old Boys' Association in 1914.

As a tribute to Rev Nagle, Tan Sri Tan dedicated a scholarship in his name in 1963.

Peach Scholarship

Although Rev Preston L Peach was associated with the Anglo-Chinese School in Singapore for only three short years from 1922 to 1924, it so happened that he became principal at a time that was critical to illustrious ACS-alumnus, Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan. It was in 1922 that Tan Sri Tan's father passed away. As the eldest son, he was involved in elaborate funeral rites just prior to his exams. As he did not have enough time to revise his subjects, he did not do well. His education might have been cut short there and then if not for Rev Peach who allowed him to sit for the finals. He passed well.

To show his gratitude to Rev Peach who had ensured he completed his schooling and to commemorate the missionary's contributions to ACS, Tan Sri Tan created a scholarship in the principal's name in 1963.

Hoisington Scholarship

Born in 1880 in Ceylon (now Sri Lanka), Mr Henry Martyn Hoisington is a name that continues to live on in the Anglo-Chinese Schools' annals thanks to two things he did when he taught there: in 1922, he gave extra maths lessons to one young boy to help him pass a crucial examination; and in 1926, he composed the ACS anthem.

Today, the ACS anthem continues to be sung with vigour and love and the young boy he helped grew up to become a successful banker. In 1963, Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan honoured his maths teacher with a scholarship in Mr Hoisington's name.

Thio Chan Bee Scholarship

Indonesian-born Dr Thio Chan Bee became the first Asian principal of ACS in 1952, and remained at its helm until 1960. Dr Thio was himself an old boy of the school. During his tenure as principal of ACS, Dr. Thio established the School Welfare Council (SWC), which paved the way for students to contribute their ideas for the betterment of the school community. ACS also became the first Methodist school in Southeast Asia to have a Board of Governors.

In 1995, a scholarship in memory of his contributions to ACS was set up by Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan.

Goh Hood Keng Scholarship

Rev Goh Hood Keng, born in 1888, was educated at the Anglo-Chinese School. Like many ACSians before him, he returned to ACS to teach and in time became one of the most revered teachers the school has ever known. He was also the first Straits-born Chinese to enter the local ministry of the Methodist Church.

In 1999, Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan created a scholarship in Rev Goh's name to honour his contributions towards education.

CB Paul Scholarship

Rev. Charles Blackshear Paul, born 1895 in Sri Lanka, was one of the four Anglo-Chinese School educators honoured by Tan Sri (Dr) Tan Chin Tuan for the part they played in helping him secure the concession to sit for his Junior Cambridge School Certificate even though he had not done well in the preliminary examinations.

Rev. Paul had joined ACS in Singapore in 1911 as a pupil and, in the tradition of ACS, returned after being trained as a teacher to teach Latin, Scripture and English. His able teaching of Latin won him commendation from the Cambridge examiners.

Together with another ACS Old Boy, William T. Cherry, Jr., he started the ACS Eleventh Boy Scout Troop, the first Singapore school to do so.

The scholarship in Rev. Paul's name was created in 1968.
